What is on the ballot November 8th?

One question requesting permission to borrow funds not to exceed \$48.9M.

Shall the Beaver Dam Unified School District, Dodge County, Wisconsin be authorized to issue pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$48,900,000 for the public purpose of paying the cost of a school building and improvement program consisting of: additions, remodeling, renovations and site improvements at the high school campus; safety and security improvements at district school buildings; and acquisition of furnishings, fixtures and equipment?

Why is the District proposing the referendum?

Commitment to provide a safe, secure and equitable high school facility for all students that enables staff to prepare students to be college and career ready when they leave Beaver Dam High School.

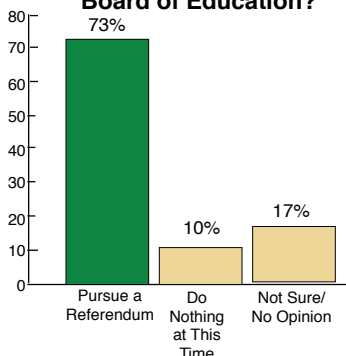
Commitment to address Beaver Dam High School's infrastructure needs as part of a comprehensive, long-term master plan to cost-effectively address district-wide facility needs.

Commitment to provide safe, secure and equitable access to our high school facility for community walking groups, community music and theater groups, youth sports clubs, area first responder training, large community trade shows, etc.

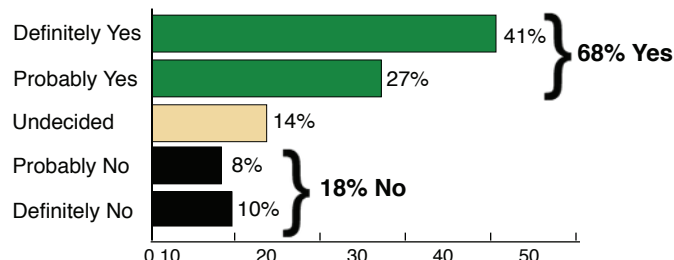
Commitment to provide safe and secure visitor entrance systems at all schools that meet 2016 school safety standards.

REFERENDUM FACT SHEET

What is included in the referendum?

Our board of education and administration worked in partnership with our staff and community for the past 18-months to evaluate and prioritize facility needs at Beaver Dam High School and safety and security needs across all schools in our district. The proposed referendum would fund a complete repair and revitalization of Beaver Dam High School as outlined below and would renovate all school entrances and office areas to meet 2016 school safety standards.

SAFETY and SECURITY

- ✓ Safe and secure entrance systems at all schools
- ✓ Asbestos removal
- ✓ Efficient heating, cooling, plumbing and lighting systems
- ✓ Equitable locker room facilities for male and female students
- ✓ ADA compliant, handicap accessibility
- ✓ Renovate all classrooms to create safe, modern learning environments
- ✓ Create safe and appropriate cafeteria and student commons areas

CAREER READY

- ✓ Technology Education: centrally located within Beaver Dam High School
- ✓ Fabrication Lab: real life experiences in manufacturing
- ✓ Culinary Arts: access to the district's commercial kitchen for training
- ✓ Agri-Science: double classroom size to increase real-world opportunities

COMMUNITY ACCESS

- ✓ Access to safe, secure and well-maintained buildings year-around
- ✓ Increased opportunities for community activities
