**Summative Assessments:** (this shall constitute 70% of the term grade) Our goal is to assess what the students have learned from what we have taught. Summative assessments reflect the format and content of the formative learning opportunities.

**Make-up Policy for Summative Assessment**: The student may redo the summative assessment one time within one week after completing all formative tasks, <u>and necessary additional practice</u>. It is the student's responsibility to advocate for this opportunity and make the necessary arrangements.

<u>Cumulative Final</u>: At the end of the semester, there will be a cumulative final exam. Students will not be allowed to retake this assessment. This will comprise 15% of the semester grade.

**Absences:** Students who miss work due to absences are expected to make it up ASAP. Work due the day a student is absent will be expected the day of their return, including tests, projects, presentations or quizzes. If a student is absent the day before a quiz/test, they should expect to take it upon returning from the absence.

**Extra Credit**: Students who are having difficulty may make arrangements for extra help. Credit may be given for attending tutoring sessions, but <u>otherwise extra credit is not available</u>.

<u>Late work</u> is reduced 20% per day late, *including homework and projects*. All daily work is expected to be <u>100% complete</u> when graded, or will receive a zero until completed for a late grade.

<u>Cheating</u> will result in a zero and an academic dishonesty referral for any person involved. This includes the use of translators, <u>copying other students' work or homework</u>, **or** <u>allowing others to copy</u> finished work.

**<u>Retesting</u>**: Students may arrange to retake a test or quiz within two school days of getting back the first attempt, at the teacher's convenience. **Retaken tests/quizzes are averaged with the <u>original score</u>**.
