Roger Noll is always eager to get involved with the educational process and youth related activities or events. Through his leadership at the Dodge County Historical Society, students have experienced many successful collaborations between school and the museum. Noll was instrumental in the research, design, and construction of the one-room schoolhouse at the Dodge County Historical Society. This attraction has become the most popular among the children who visit the museum. Fourth graders participate on an Architecture Walk in the fall, which ends at the museum. Students are always excited to visit the one-room school-house and learn about the history of school and education.

He volunteered for the Project AWARE program and is currently a volunteer for the PaLs (Partners in Learning) program. Noll came up with the idea of having a Traveling Trunk display as a supplement to the fourth grade social studies curriculum.

Noll has been active with the community theatre including time spent co-designing, building, and constructing the "traveling curtain" for the 2002 Tell-A-Tale production of *Oz*, building of the tower for the 2001 Middle School Summer School production of *Rapunzel, Let Down Your Hair*, and recently providing a critique and suggestions to a group of students working on a play to be published and performed at the theatre.
