
One Book, One School

During the month of January, we will be participating in One Book, One School activities, which is an all-school and family reading event. The book that was selected this year is Charlotte's Web. Charlotte's Web, by E.B. White is considered a classic among children's literature, receiving recognition as a Newbery Honor Book, a Great American Read according to PBS, and Laura Ingalls Wilder Award recipient. The book should provide ample discussion opportunities with your child while reading the book together. The purpose of One Book, One School is to reinforce the connection between literacy at home and school as well as help students develop consistent reading habits.

A 20 day suggested reading schedule is attached. Depending on the student's age, students can read the book to you or you can read the book to them. Each Friday during January, classes will participate in a question/answer session with discussions that reinforce important literacy skills and concepts.

Additionally, we will be hosting a book swap later in January where students can bring in books they have read and exchange them for other books at school. More details will be coming regarding the book swap.

January Assessments

Aimsweb & i-Ready

During the month of January, our students will be taking some formalized assessments. These include:

Aimsweb Early Literacy Screener (grades K-3).

This is a required state assessment to help us determine any students that are at-risk in their reading skills.

i-Ready Reading & Math Diagnostics

These computerized assessments give us

information on how students have grown over the first semester and some specific next steps in each student's learning.

More information about each of these assessments will be sent home on January 2nd. Your child's results from these assessments will also be sent home in January.

A special thank you to Mr. Pete Duesterbeck and the Key Club students for their assistance collecting and delivering all the food.





ABOUT THE WALL OF FAME

In 1997, the district and community recognized Actor Fred MacMurray, a 1925 Beaver Dam High School graduate, as the first recipient of the Outstanding Alumni Award. In 1998, the district formed a district/community committee and, each year, the committee accepts nominations from the public to consider selection of one Outstanding Alumni and up to five Friends of Education.

The Wall of Fame display is located adjacent to the High School Auditorium. It honors all Wall of Fame recipients and provides inspiration to future graduates.

AWARD CATEGORIES

OUTSTANDING ALUMNI:

A graduate of the Beaver Dam Unified School District who has made exceptional accomplishments may be nominated for the Outstanding Alumni award. One alumnus may receive this award each year. Nominees must fulfill one or more of the following criteria:

- · made outstanding contributions to society
- is a person of historical significance
- displayed outstanding leadership
- · has been a prominent local, state, national and/or world figure

FRIENDS OF EDUCATION

Individuals* or organizations that have provided distinguished service to the Beaver Dam Unified School District and its students may be nominated for the Friends of Education award. Up to 5 individuals or 4 individuals and 1 organization may receive the award each year.

*Current employees of the Beaver Dam Unified School District are not eligible for this award. Nominations of former Beaver Dam Unified School District employees will be considered based upon voluntary contributions not related to their employment with the district.
