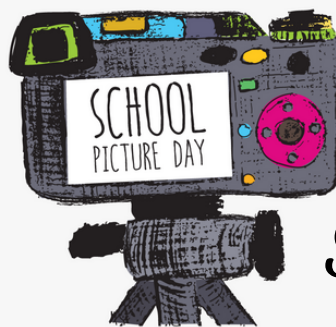

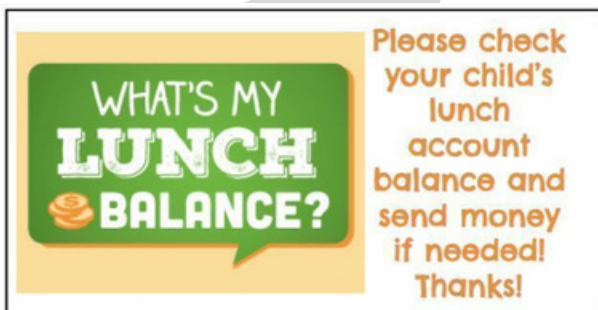

**No medication will be administered by school personnel unless and until a Medication Consent form is completed. A completed Medication Consent includes written parental authorization to administer medication in school and written instructions from a licensed health care professional for prescription medication. Over-the-counter medication requires written parental authorization only. All medication must be kept in the school office. Students are not allowed to keep them in their backpack/locker.
