The Beaver Dam Unified School District offers a comprehensive Summer School program to students in the Beaver Dam area. Our summer program is available to children regardless of whether they attend public, parochial, or homeschool during the regular school year.

The BDUSD summer program continues to offer a variety of skill building and enrichment courses. Skill building courses are remedial in nature and are designed to support student growth in academics. Our enrichment courses provide students with learning activities that broaden their skills, enrich their interests, and extend their current academic level. Courses that do not have a sufficient number of students enrolled may be cancelled.

Teachers will often recommend that a student enroll in Summer School to further develop the skills and abilities needed to carry on the work to the next grade level. Parents are urged to give serious thought to such recommendations.

Please review the information in this course book and consider enrolling your child(ren) in the Beaver Dam Unified School District's Elementary Summer School Program to take advantage of these worthwhile educational opportunities.

Courses are not guaranteed. If a course reaches capacity, students will be placed on a waiting list and/or in an alternate course.

Courses must be selected based on the grade level your child is in for the 2024-25 school year. Most courses are 45 minutes long. Reading classes are 90 minutes long. Students may take up to 4 summer school classes to equal a full summer school day (8:30 am – 12:35 pm). Students taking a reading class may take up to 3 summer school classes.

Summer School Supplies

Students attending summer school will leave the supplies they used during the school year at their school on the last day of the 2024-25 school year. These supplies will be labeled with their name and sent to Prairie View for the student to use during summer school. At the end of summer school, these supplies will be sent home with the student.

Each shuttle bus will be supervised by summer school staff. **Students should have their summer school schedules with them when they get on the bus.** During morning pick-up times, students will receive identification to show which shuttle bus they are riding that day. Shuttle bus stops & schedules will be included with your child's schedule. Any student may ride the shuttle bus and there is no need to sign your child up to ride the shuttle.

ON OUR WAY TO KINDERGARTEN

Students Entering Kindergarten Fall of 2025

This class is open for students who are entering kindergarten in the fall. The purpose of this class is to provide an opportunity for children to further develop school readiness skills and help prepare them for kindergarten.

GETTING READY FOR FIRST GRADE

Grade Level: KG

Getting Ready for First Grade is intended for children who need additional readiness work in multiple areas to prepare them for first grade. Children must have completed one year of kindergarten. Students enrolled in this course may register for an additional enrichment course to end their summer school day.

MATH MAGIC

Grade Level: 1

Math Magic is designed for students completing 1st grade who need additional instruction and practice with kindergarten math concepts.

READING EXPRESS

Grade Level: 1

Reading Express is for students completing 1st grade who need additional reading instruction and practice during the summer to be on track for 2nd grade. Instruction will be directed toward reinforcement and re-teaching the reading strategies introduced during the school year.

MASTERING MATH

Grade Level: 2 & 3

Mastering Math is designed for students completing 2nd or 3rd grade who need additional instruction and practice with 2nd & 3rd grade math concepts.

SAY YES TO READING

Grade Level: 2

Say Yes to Reading is designed for students completing 2nd grade who need additional reading instruction to refine and maintain reading skills learned during the school year.

GUIDING READERS

Grade Level: 3

Guiding Readers is designed for students completing 3rd grade who need additional reading instruction to refine and maintain reading skills learned during the school year

MATH CONNECTION

Grade Level: 4 & 5

Math Connection is designed for students completing 4th or 5th grade who need additional instruction and practice with 4th and 5th grade math concepts.

READING CONNECTION

Grade Level: 4 & 5

Reading Connection is designed for students completing 4th or 5th grade who need improvement in their reading development. This class will provide extra practice in both reading and writing. It emphasizes strategies to enhance reading fluency, comprehension, and writing skills.






Online Summer School Enrollment

Summer School will use an online form in Skyward Family Access for enrollment. Please login to your Family Access account and complete the online form to enroll your child in Summer School. Forms must be completed using a web browser. They are not available in the Skyward App. Forms may only be completed by the primary family listed in Skyward.

If you do not know or remember your login and password, please use the "Forgot your Login/Password" link on the Skyward login page found on the bdusd.org website.

When you log in to Family Access, you will see a message on the main screen that there is an online form available to fill out. Just click on the "Fill out Online Form" link. You can also click on the Online Forms tab on the left side menu bar and click on the Fill Out Form link from the drop down.



On the form screen, you will see the form to complete. If you would like to view the form full size instead of scrolling, click on the View Full Screen button.
