## Reader's Workshop

This week we read Dear Dragon, a story about unusual pen pals that write to one another. This has fit in perfectly with our writing over the last couple of weeks.:)

## Math

We are continuing our study of using multiplication strategies to solve facts, specifically $6 \mathrm{~s}, 7 \mathrm{~s}, 8 \mathrm{~s}$, and 9 s ! Students can use break apart as a strategy to help them. For
example, $7 \times 8$ could be broken apart into $5 \times 8$ and $2 \times 8$ and then added together. This helps students answer questions more efficiently.

X4's facts have come home to add to the flash card pile! The expectation is that students are practicing these facts nightly! Thank you!

## Writing/ Grammar

The students are wrapping up their pen pal letters to the students at Washington Elementary this week.

In grammar, students are learning more about action and being verbs.

## Social Studies
