Course Description:					
Psychology is the study of behavior and mental process. This class will focus on the psychological method of data collection, brain structure and function, consciousness, learning, memory, intelligence, motivation, personality theories, and psychological disorders. Grading for this class is based on eight content standard assessments, participation and daily classwork.					
Learning Targets:					
 I can interpret observable behavior from seven different broad psychological perspectives. I can describe and explain the brain's structure and function and how it influences learning and behavior. (E 12. 1) I can use research skills of the behavioral sciences to develop an informed position on an issue. (E 12.14) I am aware of their different states of consciousness and understand the importance of sleep. I recognize how people learn differently and know my own learning strengths. I can summarize psychoanalytic personality perspectives and apply them to my own life. I can identify factors that influence a person's mental health and define common psychological disorders (E 12. 15)
